
Au Revoir from Pastor Lori

Mary Poppins taught us that supercalifragilistic expialidocious is the word to say when you don't know what to say. This crazy "word" makes for a mood-lifting song but is not actually useful in most situations! When I don't know quite what to say, I pick up my Book of Common Prayer. Its pages contain Holy Scripture, prayers derived from the ancient church, and the words of faithful followers who lived in times of great strife.

Today I paged through the BCP and, not finding what I was looking for, I then turned to another useful resource: The Book of Occasional Services. Yes, our Episcopal tradition has an actual compilation of rituals and circumstances that happen only "occasionally." These occasions include: Prayers for Rogation Days/A Rite for the Blessing of a Garden, Service for All Hallows' Eve, Blessing of a Creche, and A Service for the Ending of a Pastoral Relationship and Leave-taking from a Congregation. This last resource is what I was searching for and below are words from one of its prayers:

"O God, you have bound us together for a time as pastor and people to work for the advancement of your kingdom in this place: We give you humble and hearty thanks for the ministry which we have shared in this year now past."

All relationships, pastoral and otherwise, come to an end. Relationships evolve and change as we know from the death of loved ones who are gone from our sight but alive in our hearts. We will no longer be in a pastoral relationship, but we will ever remain friends in Christ. Knowing from the beginning that we had only this one year as pastor and people doesn't make it any easier as we reach its end. The cost of love is grief at its loss. It is a price always worth paying.

Interviews to offer a glimpse into the lives of longtime members of Church of the Incarnation.

Ardelle Watkins

Who says a woman can't make it as a homesteader in Montana? Ardelle Watkins's grandmother left NYC in 1910 where there were no opportunities for women, and with her mother took a train to Chester with her beloved canary. Grandma set up home in the Sweet Grass Hills where she met Ardelle's Norwegian grandfather when he came across the border from Canada. They married and started a family. Ardelle's parents bought the old homestead house for \$30 next to her grandparents and eventually had indoor plumbing. Ardelle and her two brothers attended a one-room schoolhouse in Sweetgrass Hills, where she was the only student in her class. She didn't care for that arrangement and felt the teachers weren't very good. After completing 8th grade, she attended Shelby High School which was much better. Following high school graduation she enrolled at Kinman business school in Spokane. This gave her the education and training she needed to get a job at the bank in Shelby where she learned a a lot about finance from her boss and his brother who became good friends of hers.

She met her husband, Bruce, through his brother. After they married they went to Fort Worth, Texas, where Bruce had a job as a helicopter pilot trainer for men heading for war in Viet Nam. Ardelle loved living in TX, but Great Falls was calling, and in 1964 they settled in Great Falls when Bruce bought the beer distributing business Gusto Distributing which was run by Bruce and four employees. Over the years it has been a very successful business and a wonderful contributor to the Great Falls community. Ardelle still owns the business and her son, Lenny, is the manager.

Ardelle and Bruce have two children, Lee Anne who is an Episcopal priest in Minnesota and Lenny. Besides Lenny, her grandchildren, Shyam and Madison, live in GF and are employed at the family business.

Ardelle has enjoyed life in GF. She has been a member of the Junior League, Ad Club as well as other local organizations. Her favorite activity at parties was charades which she'd love to be doing today. Around 1980 she flew with the kids to Richmond, VA where they picked up a truck for the business. It allowed her to take the kids to New York City and Washington DC. It was such a good trip that they repeated it next year picking up another truck for the business. Their cabin on Holter Lake provided many years of enjoyment for the entire family.

Ardelle grew up Presbyterian, however, there was no commitment to any church. Ardelle went to Incarnation to seek information and ended up chatting all afternoon with Jackson Gilliam about our US involvement in Viet Nam. She learned a lot about the Episcopal religion from Jackson, joined the church and has been a member since 1965. She has served on the vestry, altar guild, provided goodies for many coffee hours and most recently served as treasurer of the Memorial Foundation. As we can all attest, Ardelle has been a committed member of the Church of the Incarnation.
